The Knights' history with the March for Life

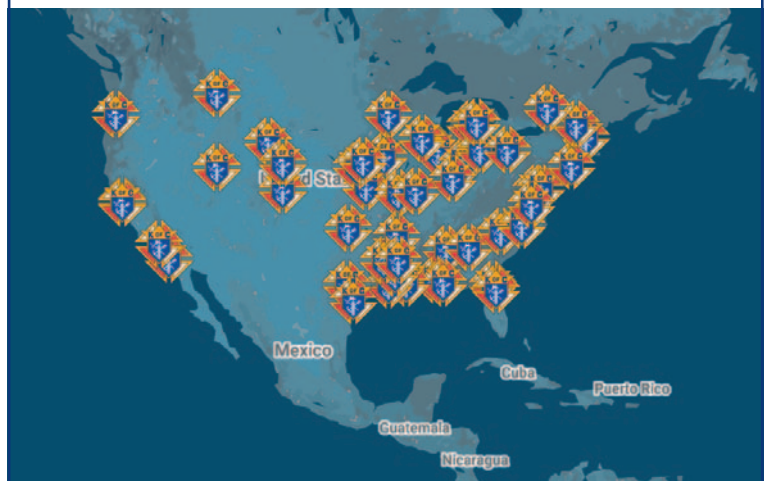

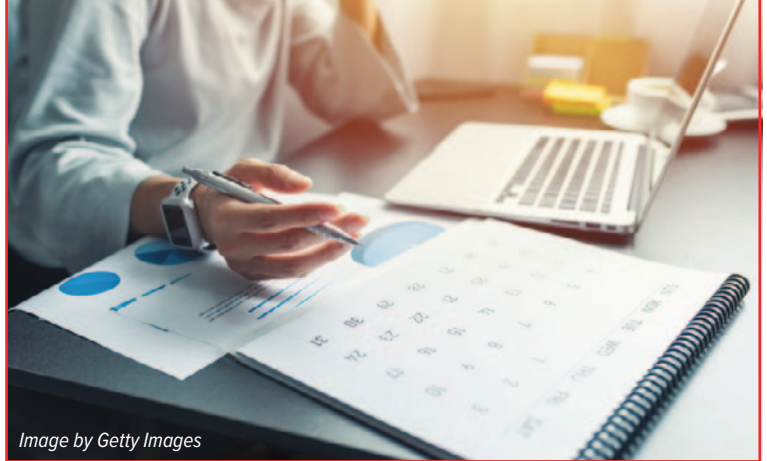
